It will then be ready for you to use. And, if you were at the December general meeting where Aladdin exhibited *Stuffit Deluxe*, you also know that *Stuffit Expander 5.0* will not expand certain (non-stuffit) archives without either *DropStuff 5.0* (not out yet) or *Stuffit Deluxe 5.0*. If you have a problem expanding with *Stuffit Expander 5.0*, try an earlier version.

TIP O' THE MONTH

From Your Shareware Team

Clippings - this from MacTip #40 at the Macintosh Guy

If you don't already know, you can easily save a bit of text from many applications by simply selecting it and dragging it onto the desktop or any other finder window (MacOS 7.6 or later) to create a clipping. This does not work with web browsers, unfortunately. To do this with web text, select the text, copy (command-C), then paste in a clipable application like SimpleText, the Scrapbook, Stickies, or even the Note Pad. THEN drag to the desktop or finder window.

Why do this? For one thing, clippings are terribly easy to create: select, drag. Secondly, you can see the clipping any time, just double-click. Third, you can clip anything which will go in the scrapbook - essentially turning your desktop or a finder window into a free-form scrapbook - text, sounds, pics, movies. Then double-click to read the text, hear the sound, see the pict, or watch the movie. Finally, when you decide where you want them to go, just drag them back into a new document (in a clipable application, naturally). For instance, tired of entering your email address in a zillion places? Clip it, then drag it in next time. Or if you have a document with 5 paragraphs you want to rearrange, clip them, then drag them back in the correct order.

Minor problem, however, alluded to at our September shareware demo - before MacOS 8.5, all clipping files have the same name: "text clipping" (or Pict clipping or sound clipping....). We showed a little extension called Clipping Namer to help fix this. Well, as you guessed, MacOS 8.5 gives better naming.

That's not all! Mac OS 8.5 makes handling Internet URLs (Uniform Resource Locators) much easier. It checks clipping contents for certain types of Internet Locations including http (for web pages), ftp (for transferring files), file (for files on your hard drive or local network), email (for email addresses), nntp (for usenet news URLs), afp & AppleTalk (for locations on Macintosh networks). Then double clicking a clipping file containing an email address will open a new email addressed to that address. Double clicking a clipping file that contains the URL for a Web page will open your web browser and load that web page over the Internet. You can even drag a server from the Network Browser out as a clipping file that can be double clicked to open a window in the Network Browser with all the Volumes available from that server. The application selected is controlled by settings in the Internet control panel (which now has most of the capabilities of Internet Config, a SMUG shareware standard). And each different type clipping has a different custom icon. Try it!

Mac basics we sometimes forget.

Is there any way to increase an app's memory size when it is run from a locked volume like CD? Normally, no. To change the size, normally, you open the info window and change the minimum and preferred memory size. Then close the get info window, and start the app. But on a CD, everything is locked on the disc - in other words, you cannot change the size recorded in the info dialogue. But there IS a way:

What you need is AppSizer, which lets you set an application's memory partition size when you launch it. For more information, see an earlier newsletter.

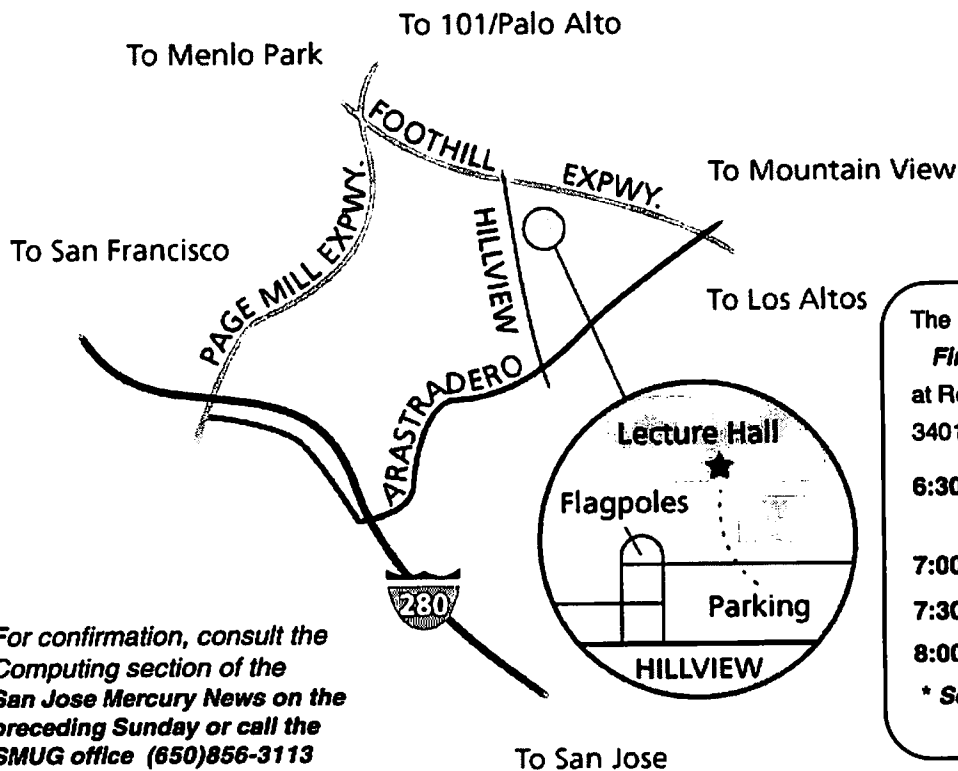
