COMPOSER *Bill Maxwell*

An overview of Composer and its features

Netscape Composer integrates powerful What-You-See-Is-What-You-Get (WYSIWYG) document creation capabilities into Netscape Communicator's already rich set of World Wide Web features. In addition to electronic mail, threaded discussion group, and file transfer features included in Netscape Communicator, Composer makes composing for the Web, email, or newsgroups a simple cut-and-paste, drag-and-drop process.

The document creation capabilities in Netscape Composer are designed to provide both experienced and beginning content creators with a simple yet powerful solution for editing and publishing online documents. WYSIWYG editing allows first-time users to create dynamic online documents easily and publish them to local file systems and remote servers with ease. / *Free*

DOT MAC *Frank Smith*

Create Your Own Home on the Web

HomePage lets you create personalized websites to showcase your interests and life events, share photos and movies, and more. Since HomePage takes care of all the HTML coding, you're free to focus on creativity and communication.

Design. Publish. Share

It couldn't be simpler to create your own site. First, select a theme from our vast selection of templates. Then add your own photos, movies and documents, click the Publish button, and you are done.

Multiple Sites - and Security, Too

HomePage lets you maintain multiple sites, so you can have a personal site for friends and family and separate sites for hobbies or work. Need security? Use the password-protection option to control who can visit a site. / *Medium price*

DREAMWEAVER *Steve Bellamy*

Dreamweaver by Macromedia is not a folk rock song from the 70s but an oddly named software program that allows you to build a website yourself making use of the Mac's graphical interface without either having to write HTML

code or rely on fixed templates. As you build the page from images and text, Dreamweaver writes the code for you in the background. You can display the code or the page layout or both on the screen.

If you do write your own code, Dreamweaver will helpfully point out any errors (like forgetting to close HTML tags), but you don't have to write any if you can't or don't want to. You can type text or drag images onto the layout page and see immediately what it will look like, then check how it looks in any browser with just a couple of keystrokes.

Additionally, Dreamweaver helps you manage your website easily - you can see your files on the computer and on the website next to each other and make changes to the site simply by dragging files from one window to another. Having said all this, it is actually helpful if you do know some HTML or at least have some understanding of the principles of building web pages with HTML and/or CSS (cascading style sheets). Dreamweaver has become the industry standard for building websites because of its integration with other programs such as Flash and because it is both more flexible and writes more elegant and simpler code than rival programs such as Microsoft's Front Page or Adobe's Go Live. / *High price*

August Meeting Report

We had the great pleasure of having Bill Atkinson make this presentation to SMUG members and to many folks who saw our writeup in several newspapers. The first part of the presentation was Bill's description of the early history of the Macintosh and how it developed from the Apple "Lisa" predecessor computer.



Bill described items that were pulled from the Lisa and transformed, one by one—each step of the way, into the "Mac" operating environment—just awesome.

The second part described how Bill had the idea for his new book *Within the Stone* and his long standing interest in geology and the wonderful patterns and colors found within particular rocks from around the world. Of even more spectacular interest was the detailed description of how his book was put together and collaborated with the folks in Japan. The intricacies of digital color transfer from image to lens to camera to press to paper were explained in detail. At this Bill is an expert and a past master of this art. The Japanese printing company estimated they save approximately ONE MILLION DOLLARS a month using Bill's color management techniques.

Compost 1.1.2

Compost is a preference pane and daemon that allows per-user limits on the maximum size and age of trash contents. It will incrementally purge files to meet those restrictions.

Requires OSX 10.2+. Free.



CopyPaste Lite 1.0.1

The lite version of the one and only award winning easy to use multiple clipboard editing and display utility. This version gives you hundreds of clipboards at your fingertips in the most convenient way. Access the clipboard via keyboard, menubar, contextual menus or floating palette.

Fish can be shared with others over the local network using Rendezvous.

Holding Pattern 1.0

Turns your idle computer screen into an airplane win-

dow, complete with a moving aerial view. Each time the screensaver plays, a unique flight path forms. Be patient: Let the screensaver play for a while, and you'll see that this flight does have a destination.

Requires OSX 10.1+. Free.



MacJanitor 1.2.1

MacJanitor allows you to manually startup daily, weekly, and monthly cron maintenance scripts. These scripts are important when keeping MacOS X in "good shape".

Usually, these scripts are set to automatically launch at times of the day when little activity occurs. However, if your Mac is turned off during these times, then the maintenance scripts don't have a chance to run.

Sogudi 0.4.3b

Sogudi is an add-on for Apple's Safari Web Browser that allows you to visit and search your favorite sites using just a few simple keystrokes in the location bar instead of long and complex URLs. These shortcuts allow you to enter additional parameters that would not be possible with standard bookmarks. Sogudi comes loaded with several common shortcuts and more can be added by the user.

Spendthrift 614a

A Cocoa-based personal finance program with day-to-day money-management tools as well as scheduled transactions, interest, reporting, and graphing abilities.

Apple Store Opportunity

(Referring to an article in July '04 SMUG Newsletter, pg. 2 "Michael Jackson, Apple-speaks at SMUG")

I stopped by the downtown Palo Alto Apple Store and spoke to xxxxx a 50ish saleslady who got in touch with "Daniel", a younger salesman. They agreed that Michael Jackson teaches .Mac classes at the Apple store and sometimes makes offers of reduced rates to his "students". They further agreed that if a current SMUG member were to bring in their copy of the July newsletter and show it to a "salesperson", the store would honor Jackson's offer — which was \$30 off the retail price.

While there, I picked up a copy of the store's standard class schedule and noted this:

- Mac presentation—each Sunday 2pm, each Friday 1pm (an hour long)

Mac OS X P/A Apple Store to You: Michael Jackson.

Michael Jackson from the Palo Alto Apple Store presented their new Apple •Mac (Dot Mac) Subscription Service. He was ably assisted in the background by Apple Store Mac Genius **Scott Player**. This new service costs \$99- per year (\$30- per year for SMUG users). Its an unique service and works something like this: First, sign up and get a User ID. Then get from Apple access to an "I disk" on their server. This is a 100 megabyte size storage space for your own use—windows/Mac. This amount of i disk storage is useful for storing and transferring files or folders through the i disk remote server. You can use multiple folders and it includes a Virex Scan utility.

You can back-up files/folders with scheduling options; import pictures from a digital camera thru the USB port to laptop, and insert the pix in your own •Mac home page. You can even have sub-accounts for your own friends or clients to access.

This is a real nice application/service and it should have a lot of people and children, etc. who want to have an easy to create Web site without all of the things that have to be done when creating your "own" home Web site from home (or office) without all of the difficulty/work of creating one's own Web site from scratch. And it doesnt not leave any "cookies" on one's own computer. You can even save a virtual (local copy of i disk) on one's own computer so one doesn't have to be hooked up to the internet.

Glowing Financials Sales up 25%, profits tripled from same quarter in 2003.

Heads of State

Steve Jobs has undergone surgery for removal of a rare and treatable form of pancreatic cancer. CEO expects to return to work in September. VP of Worldwide Sales Tim Cook will lead the company in Jobs's absence.

New Cinema Displays

Revised line of Cinema Displays introduced
Flat panel sizes are now 20, 23, and a whopping 30 inches. 17" model discontinued.

New hydra display connector used; supports PCs. Pricing is \$1299, \$1999, and \$3299 respectively. Additional big-screen gotcha: top-of-the-line 30" model requires additional \$600 graphics card.

Price Cuts on Outgoing Cinema Display Inventory 17" now at \$664; 20" at \$1150, 23" at \$1754 (while supplies last via our Account Exec at Club Mac). Connects with single, elegant cable to PowerMac G4 or PowerMac G5s with Apple Display Connector.

Rarefied Minis

Seen an iPod Mini anywhere?
Introduced in January to great demand.
Apple having problems getting needed 4GB microdrive in quantity. Relatively few Minis shipped; very hard to get.

Enter the New Maxis

Standard iPod upgraded to incorporate neat Click Wheel technology used in the Mini. Pricing for the 20 GB model is \$299; for the 40 GB, \$399
Non-click models inventory reflect slightly reduced pricing; may drop further as supplies of new models come in.

Airport Shrinks

Apple introduces Airport Express mini-base station
Lower \$120 price. Easy way to repeat and extend wireless signal from an Airport Extreme base station.
Can work alone if entire network is wireless.
Combo digital/analog audio jack supports streaming iTunes music to stereo from any Mac on the network.
"Neat product."

MIA: Older Airport Cards

Apple has stopped manufacturing older Airport (802.11b) cards. "I can't see the valid reason for doing this."
PowerMac G4, CRT iMacs, PowerBook G3, and iBook G3s no longer have an internal wireless solution; external solutions exist but I have not used them
Titanium PowerBook G4 users can use a non-Apple card that goes in the external PC slot.

Dirt Cheap Visit With Relatives and Friends

Got Panther and Broadband access? Just add iSight, Apple's \$145 video camera. "Old news by now, but I really like this technology." Now works with recent PC operating systems and AOL. Mac OS X v 10.4 (i.e., "Tiger") to be released, next year will extend capability to allow up to four people to video chat at the same time.

Apple Blows iMac Transition

Inventory of flat-panel iMacs runs out before new models are ready. IBM manufacturing issues with new G5 chip appear to be the cause. New iMac line now said to be introduced in September. Apple decides not to build more of the current model in the interim.

eMacs Not Available Remaining stock used to fill the iMac hole in the school market.

Faster PowerMac G5s Behind Schedule

Promised 3 GHz models for June long past target date. IBM chip manufacturing issues again at fault.
New dual 2.5 GHz, "water-cooled" model announced; said to ship at end of month. Prices drop on new dual 1.8 and 2.0 GHz models, but some specs trimmed. (Let's discuss if your interested) Outgoing dual processor models still available.

PowerBook Speed Bumps

Processor now running at up to 1.5 GHz
Products now support up to 2GB of RAM
For power users, I recommend special configuration with faster (5400 RPM) hard drive and increased graphics RAM; will bump the price by about \$100.
Outgoing 15" and 17" models cut by \$200, 12" model

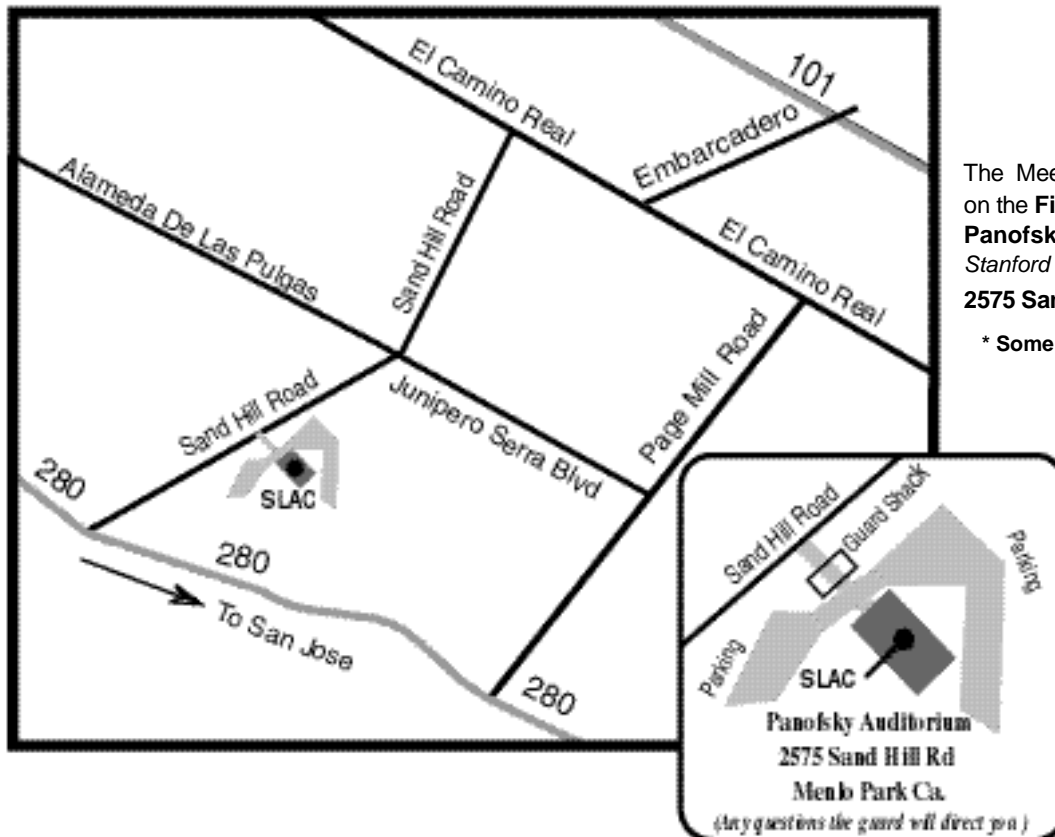
