## Elgato will be our January Presenter

The company Elgato ([www.elgato.com](http://www.elgato.com)) has created EyeTV, a television receiver and encoder for cable/broadcast/camera video that lets you record TV to your Mac.

### Elgato's Eye TV

You can control EyeTV via a remote or an on-screen menu. The EyeTV software allows you to playback the encoded video in various ways, such as wide screen, letterbox, and time-slip. Using the TitanTV website, you can schedule EyeTV recordings; you can also set up recording schedules manually. You can export the recordings to Toast (another Elgato product), iMovie, iDVD, or Quicktime (MPEG4 only).

EyeTV 200 is a Firewire MPEG2&4 video encoder, with a 124-channel cable-ready TV tuner. EyeTV 200 is compatible with Pal, SECAM, and NTSC. It also has composite, S-Video and stereo audio connectors so you can convert video. It requires at least a 500 MHz G4 and Mac OS 10.3 (it works well with the Mac mini).

EyeTV 500 encodes digital TV in HD format, provided the signal is not encrypted. Over the air broadcast digital TV usually is not encrypted, but cable provided digital TV usually is. EyeTV 500 requires a dual G5 for the best encoding/compression.

EyeTV 200 and EyeTV 500 sell for \$299.

EyeTV uses 2-8 GB per hour of video. You can choose the compression, via presets, or customized the settings. EyeTV 200 offers the most compression options, whereas the EyeTV 500 is a lossless recorder.

Look for a new super product in the near future, maybe January.

At present, EyeTV works with only one disk archive at a time, but you can change the location in the preferences.

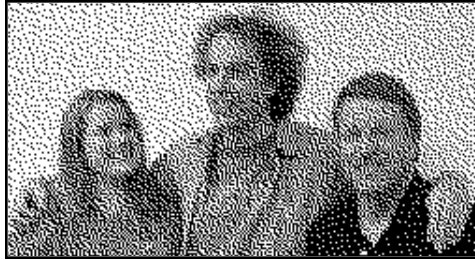

### NOVEMBER MEETING HIGHLIGHTS! *reported by David Strom*

**Q&A Session**—A member has been trying to export a slideshow to iDVD, and the export would not work with 30 or more photos. There were no suggestions. Anyone having an answer to this anomaly might bring it up in the December Session.

A gentleman was trying to send addresses (physical addresses, not just email) from his Netscape 7 address book. He tried converting the addresses into a PDF (printing options), but it resulted in a mess. People suggested exporting the address book into the Apple address book or into Thunderbird. He would probably have to convert it into Excel as a transition; I had to do this when I transferred my Newton address book to my Palm.

Steve (our memory guy) has iPod voice recordings that were sync'd with iTunes, and can't release the iPod memory from those recordings. Several suggestions related to looking at preferences and verifying how data is stored. The Omniweb browser lets you drag your iPod into it and you can then see all your iPod files. Steve might call the Griffin company as he used iMic to make the recordings.

### 3D-Space VFS 1.4.2

### AcidSearch 0.6

AcidSearch is a search enhancement for Safari. It adds unlimited "Search Channels" to the Google search field. Channels can be customized in a nearly infinite variety of ways. AcidSearch also includes powerful features such as JavaScript support, the ability to import iSeek and Butler Search Sites, true hierarchical menu organization, and the ability to search multiple search engines at the same time. AcidSearch also allows you to access your search channels with key equivalents, shortcuts (a la SafariKeywords), and a contextual menu.

### DragonDrop X 1.2.1

DragonDrop is intended to reintroduce some of the func-

tionality lost with the death of tabbed windows. We all remember tabbed windows, who trod the classic paths. Drag an open window to the bottom of the screen, and a title-tab peeks up, readily displaying its contents at a click or a drag, and collapses to insignificance at the slightest thought of dismissal.

### EasyFind 3.8.1

EasyFind is an alternative to or supplement of Spotlight and finds files, folders or contents in any file without the need for indexing. This is especially useful if you are tired of slow or impossible indexing, outdated or corrupted indices or if you are just looking for features missing in the Finder or Spotlight.

#### Highlights:

- Boolean operators, wildcards, phrases
- No indexing, search immediately
- Finds invisible files and files inside packages (which Spotlight doesn't search)
- Displays the location of each file in a separate column
- Provides contextual menus and services
- Supports drag-and-drop
- Very responsive due to multithreading
- Uses little memory

### Gimp.app 2.2.8

Gimp.app is a self contained application bundle of the powerful GNU Image Manipulation Program for Mac OS X. It requires Apple's X11. Gimp.app is droppable, uses the gimp-print package built into OS X, and uses the system's default web browser for help and web browsing requests. Requires OS X 10.4+ and X11. Free.



### MathPad 2.6.4

MathPad is a general purpose graphing scientific calculator. It uses a text worksheet rather than simulating buttons on a hand held calculator. This live scratchpad interface allows you to see and edit your entire calculation.

In addition to being a handy little calculator, MathPad can also take on larger problems. Simple plotting allows quick visualization of results. General purpose arrays allow calculations involving vectors, complex numbers, matrix algebra etc. 2D arrays can be displayed as grayscale or color images. Several examples are included showing such things as equation solving, curve fitting, vector calculations and numerical solution of differential equations.

Plug-in modules provide specialized capabilities in areas such as engineering, finance, statistics, linear algebra, data analysis, sound and image processing.

### Minuteur 4.2.1

Minuteur is a full-featured timer and stopwatch application.  
**Requires OS X 10.1+. Free.**



### Recipe4mac 1.0

Recipe4mac lets you navigate through thousands of recipes from the Recipe4all.com database with a neat Mac interface. Visually resembling the Safari browser Recipe4mac allows you search recipes by keywords, by ingredients or by geography. It also has direct access to the glossary. With a single click you can see the same recipe or listing in your default web browser.  
**Requires OS X 10.3.5+. Free.**



### SetAlphaValue 1.9

SetAlphaValue is an extension for "Cocoa" applications and sets the alphaValue of windows. In others words, this program is only aesthetic, just for fun ;)  
**Requires OS X 10.3.9+. Free.**



### Zap 1.1

You are one of the engineers working at the local power plant. Being new to this work, you are always given the lousiest jobs, from polishing door knobs to solving tricky situations, and this day is no exception to that.

You noticed suddenly that energy levels are rising dangerously high, and the power plant is about to blow unless someone rearranges the control circuits to release the extra current. As everybody else has already fled, you are left alone to face the challenge of saving the power plant.

The game offers two game modes, normal and strategy. In normal game mode you have limited time to light up certain number of bulbs to save the power plant. **Battorox**—is a free utility that shows battery information, even the temperature. Not all laptops have the proper sensors to get the information to display.

**The Memtest411** app checks to see how much memory is available. It is a UNIX executable, so you open the terminal window and run it from there.

**iSwift**—is an app to run Shockwave Flash files independent of your browser. David ran Space Invaders (echoone.com/iSwift/flashfinder.html) in iSwift; it brought back happy memories for me.

**FileJuicer** app. extracts data from a file (jpegs, text, sound, and other juicy stuff) even if you don't have the app to run that file, and puts the juiced stuff into folders for you. David dragged a Powerpoint file into FileJuicer, and it showed the images that it extracted, all without using Powerpoint. It is \$8. ## ANNOUNCEMENTS

We are now printing our newsletter at Minuteman Press in Mt. View. They use Adobe InDesign also and can print a single daily color for the same price as Black and White.

## FEATURE PRESENTATION

**Valerie Franks** from the **Palo Alto Apple Store Studio** was the presenter. The Studio is Apple's software learning center; you can approach and ask your software questions anytime you like. You can also get tutoring by buying Apple ProCare (\$99 a year).

### *Adobe Photoshop CS (Creative Suite)*

Valerie created an 8.5x11 document and folded it in half. On one half: she added a layer, selected part of the layer (marching ants showing the selection), and picked her color and the paint bucket to fill the area, dragged a nice photo onto the selected layer and sized it. Then she added text (Happy Holidays!), selected the text, and transformed it (drop shadow, 100% opacity) for more visibility. On the other half: she rotated the project 180 degrees so the card would look OK when folded. Then she made the other background red, to complete the happy holiday colors! Naturally, there are plenty of filters for editing photos. And there are brightness and contrast adjustments.

Use color balance to adjust that (use more or less blue to get a cooler effect?)

**Tools!** The *lasso tool* lets you select one item from a photo and move it around. You can crop the photo. The *clone stamp tool* lets you clone a piece of the photo and then copy it to other parts of the photo. She used it to remove a tree by cloning the sky over it. (Note: If you use this over too wide of an area, you might clone areas that you did not want to copy.) This is the tool she uses when people often ask how to remove a person from a photo.

The *eyedropper tool* lets you select any color off a photo for use elsewhere in the photo. Rulers let you set lines across the photo for reference. Blur lets you do a motion blur.

### **Adobe Illustrator CS**

Valerie drew a nice oval and filled it. Then she used the pen tool to draw nice curvy lines. You can click on the points on those curvy vector lines and adjust them. There are a lot of text filters, such as arc and wave. She also used the brush to make the lines look wispy and she made WAVES like those at the beach. Mostly she used the move tool, which can also rotate. You can spray graphic symbols. She sprayed clouds, leaves, and you can bring in other graphics to spray, even photos.

Illustrator files can be saved as a PDF or other choices such as jpeg, gif, etc. Save the file in Illustrator format if you want your Illustrator image to remain editable before you saving in different formats.

**Text flow**—Valerie was able to drag in a photo directly from the finder then she dragged in rulers, moved the photo to where she wanted and put text into a text box. She made the text wrap around the photo then she Typed on a Path and had the text follow a curvy path she defined with the pen tool. She drew an oval path around the photo and typing text all around it. finally having the text wrap closely around a photo that was cropped to be an oval.

You can import text from one Creative Suite app to another.

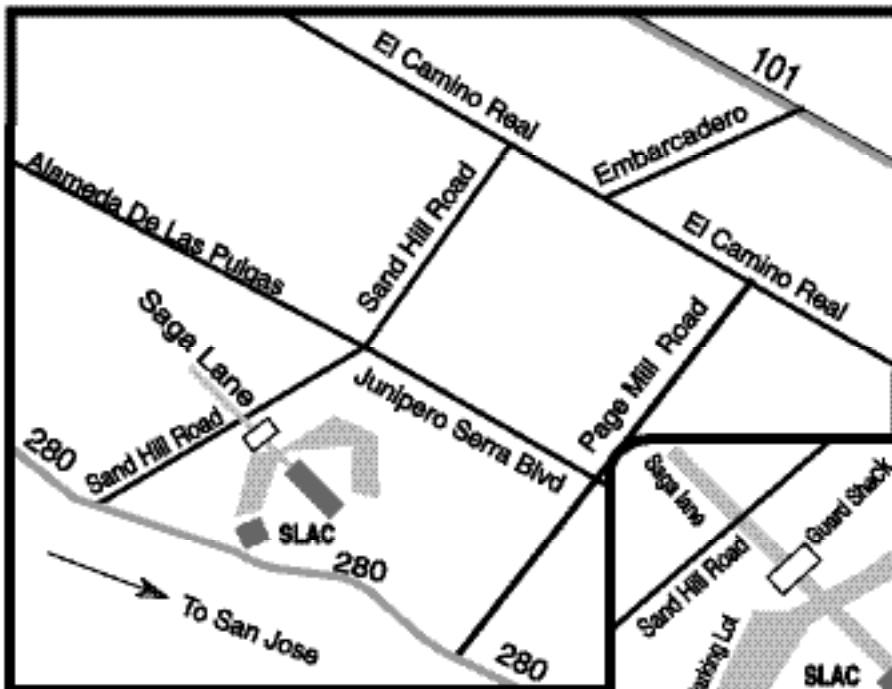

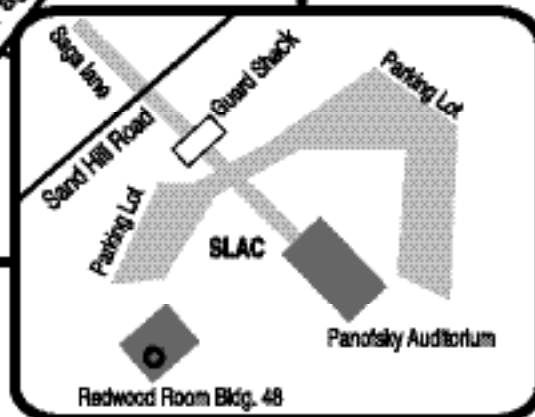
